a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Keeping track of what bonds are being discussed, proposed or issued by school districts prior to issuance. Allowing smaller school districts to coordinate purchases to achieve economies of scale. Increase the number of vendors competing for school district RFPs as a means by which to reduce cost through competition. The technology would notify a larger, national group of vendors of opportunities in order to increase competition, by increasing the number of competitors.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The clearinghouse database will keep track of what bonds are being discussed, have been proposed by a district or local board of education, and voted on by the public (with vote outcome) and therefore issued by school districts. Allowing smaller school districts to coordinate purchases to achieve economies of scale. Increase the number of vendors competing for school district RFPs as a means by which to reduce cost through competition. The technology would notify and publish to a larger, national group of vendors of the bid opportunities in order to increase competition through increasing the reach and number of competitors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

No direct services will be provided to citizens.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida students and taxpayers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Florida taxpayers will benefit from the increased competition and reduction in capital expenditures of local school districts. Students will benefit from this same reduction that will allow additional dollars to flow to the classroom. District activity tracking and reporting will provide data on the outcome.
