4. Project/Program Description

Multi-purpose Workforce Trades/Health Sciences Classroom Building - Last installment to complete building. Previous payments include \$1,230,000 in 2017, \$3,000,000 in 2018, and \$5,062,361 in 2019. This building will house three academic programs to meet workforce needs in high skill/high wage jobs in Nursing, Diagnostic Sonography and Machining. Expands our highly successful Nursing program (RN) in the largest, most diverse city in Volusia County. Job growth in these areas ranges from 9-19% in the next five years, with hourly wages between \$16-30/hour. All three occupations are Enterprise Florida Incorporated (EFI) Targeted Industries for Volusia and Flagler counties.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This building will house three academic programs to meet workforce needs in high skill/high wage jobs in Nursing, Diagnostic Sonography and Machining. Expands our highly successful Nursing program (RN) in the largest, most diverse city in Volusia County. Job growth in these areas ranges from 9-19% in the next five years, with hourly wages between \$16-30/hour. All three occupations are Enterprise Florida Incorporated (EFI) Targeted Industries for Volusia and Flagler counties. The facility replaces 11 portables that have reached end of life.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of the classroom/lab building will allow the college to expand the Nursing (RN) program into the largest and most diverse city in Volusia County, as well as offering expanded programs in Machining. A new program in Diagnostic Sonography will be opened in the building bringing a program to the region that currently has a 15% projected annual growth in job opportunities with an hourly wage over \$30/hour.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Classes leading to degrees and certificates in high skill/high wage professional areas. The building will house classrooms and laboratories for three programs not currently offered on the west side of Volusia County: a full Nursing (RN) program, Diagnostic Sonography and Machining. Job growth in these areas range from 15-30% in the next five years, with hourly wages between \$19-30/hour. All three occupations are targeted industries for Volusia and Flagler counties.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Targeted to any citizen who wishes to enter a high skill/high wage professional field, including new high school graduates, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, and incumbent workers seeking advancement. The facility will serve students in the three new programs in addition to increased enrollment campus-wide resulting from students taking associated support courses. The building will replace 11 portables that have reached end of life.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

The benefit will be local residents graduating with associates degrees in Nursing and Diagnostic Sonography, and vocational certificates in Machining. All lead to high wage jobs that are Enterprise Florida Inc targeted Industries in Volusia and Flagler counties. Graduation rates, job placement rates and annual wages are all reported to the state annually and are used in computing performance measures for each Florida State College.
