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Polk State received \$6,116,050 in CARES Act funds. As of December 31, 2020, \$3,035,000 was disbursed to 4,224 students as emergency grants to be used toward costs incurred as a result of coronavirus and \$272,535.50 had been expended to reimburse for costs associated with the purchase or lease of technology hardware and software to support students and enable distance learning; to enhance campus safety; and to reimburse students for canceled activities.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Requested funds would allow the College to address several significant security needs. The College's current surveillance system of networked cameras, blue light phones, and other devices are at the end of their useful lives. Funds would be used to upgrade these systems, augment mass communication tools, and complete target-hardening improvements.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Cyber security improvements include both software and associated hardware upgrades required to expand door access controls across all campuses and centers. Surveillance cameras will be added to campuses and centers to allow for remote observation and documentation of activities in and around College facilities. To improve district-wide emergency messaging, this project includes the purchase and installation of additional digital signage equipment at the Winter Haven Campus and new units at the Polk State JD Alexander Center. The project also includes the purchase and installation of electronic locks as well as manual locksets for interior office and classroom doors at all six campuses and centers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide enhanced safety to all students, staff, faculty, and visitors to the College's campuses and centers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Polk State College serves nearly 16,000 students each year and employees nearly 1,200 individuals. As an institution whose facilities are open to the public, the College's libraries, auditoriums, meeting spaces, and outdoor recreation facilities are frequently used by members of the community. These safety improvements will serve many individuals well beyond the immediate campus community.



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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will enhance the overall safety and security of all campuses and centers. These improvements will allow for stricter control of access to facilities, as well as documentation of where and when individuals are entering and exiting. Security improvements will also allow for remote lockdown of buildings with centralized entry systems at all campuses and centers. Enhancements to the mass communications system will provide an additional method to inform the campus community in the event of an emergency.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Reporting and penalties should be consistent with those outlined for fixed capital outlay projects.

Polk State College is a public institution and will receive and invest the capital outlay funding as described above.
