#### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Stormwater Master Plan Improvements project would provide surveying, engineering design and permitting services to supplement the study funded by DEO's Rural Infrastructure Fund (RIF). This includes upgrades to the existing drainage system and implementing centralized stormwater management facilities for flood resilience.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Surveying, engineering and inspection services as well as utilization of various construction vendors would be required to design and permit the project and ensure funds are spent in the most beneficial way to address the needed improvements. The project would provide upgraded City wide stormwater management and reduce flooding impacts to the area.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Drainage upgrades and improvements would prevent flood damage to businesses, institutions and infrastructure in the area when significant rain events occur. The improvements would reduce costs associated with flood damage for citizens as well as road and bridge closures within the City.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Funding would benefit all groups within the City as well as the County; more than 800 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Upgrades to stormwater management would prevent potential accidents and damages associated with flooding, and provide improved transportation conditions by eliminating road and bridge closures within the City. The project would provide immediate job opportunities in the area. Stormwater improvements would reduce the amount of flood waters entering the wastewater system through inundated manholes. Pre- and post-improvement surveys and inspections would be completed to compare and evaluate the existing and improved drainage system. Accident and damage reports would also be evaluated as a measure of outcome. Workforce interviews would be performed to determine the number of workers employed to construct the project. A stormwater model would be prepared by a professional engineer to evaluate the existing and proposed drainage system to demonstrate the level of benefit from implementation of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The City would award the contract through a bid process. The bid documents would address how liquidated damages for project overruns would be handled. The contractor would incur a cost per day for each day that exceeds the substantial and final completion dates. The bid documents would require that the contractor provide performance and payments bonds, and a 10% retainer would be withheld to ensure any issues are resolved or corrected in a timely fashion.
