12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Palm Beach County (PBC) in collaboration with the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC) and community-based reentry partners seeks to provide reentry participants with tools to become a contributing member of the community, stay out of jail or prison and stay on the path for a better life. By keeping our re-arrest rate below 7% we strive for increased public safety.

The Regional and State Transitional Offender Reentry (RESTORE) Initiative, established in 2011, is a comprehensive model for reentry designed to reduce recidivism by identifying needs, providing targeted evidence-based programs, and coordinating pre- and post-release services to assist individuals transitioning from incarceration to the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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All reentry staff will be sufficiently trained in the following areas; motivational interviewing, cognitive behavioral interventions, Level of Service Inventory revised assessment amongst others. In addition, staff will meet monthly with County staff to discuss relevant data, progress, resources, and barriers and provide any additional trainings. Palm Beach County's Reentry Task Force guides the reentry initiatives through quarterly meetings, voting and advisory with stakeholders who include the Public Defender, State Attorney, local judges, mental health providers, returning citizens, community based agencies, Department of Corrections, Department of Juvenile Justice, the local sheriff's office and other stakeholders. The Task Force is comprised of six sub committees that focus on the effective implementation and best practices of programming and service delivery. We utilize data gathered from our information management system to guide our decision making.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Individuals housed at Sago Palm Reentry Center will receive case management in addition to a wide variety of vocational training and life skills. Prior to any services being delivered, coordinators will administer the LSI-r assessment to determine their risk, needs and protective factors, which will guide their plan of care. Pre-release coordinators will facilitate job readiness classes, CDL and Forklift training and certification. Individuals will also be linked with their post release case manager for a minimum of 180 days prior to release to begin to develop their plan of care and ensure a smooth transition back into the community. Once an individual is released back into the community case managers will re-evaluate their assessment and discuss the plan of care. For individuals being released from all other FDC facilities in Florida, case managers provide outreach up to 180 days prior to their release to discuss reentry services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this Program will be active inmates and recently released inmates from the Florida Department of Corrections institution/facility convicted in and returning to Palm Beach County, Florida. The RESTORE will target 300 medium to high risk people, as determined by the Level of Service Inventory revised (LSI-r) Scores from completed risk assessments to provide re-entry services which support successful reintegration into the community. This population will consist of people being released from FDC, and people who may or may not be under the supervision of the Department.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is increase in public safety, a safer community, cost savings on a local and state level, continued reduction in recidivism and an overall improvement in the quality of life for those returning to our community. Outcomes will be measured by capturing data regarding rearrests, reconviction and return to FDC rates. Data collection and analysis will be evaluated on a regular basis to ensure adequate oversite and compliance.
