12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The JSA Vocational STEP program will provide students with the functional daily living and social/leisure skills needed to be fully integrated into their community and transition into adulthood. Funding will be used to create enterprises where the skills and interest of the students meet the needs of the community. Due to COVID-19 and health risks for students with comprised immune systems the goal is to bring the community to the students while building employment and community related skills.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

We propose to use this funding to secure a mission-based enterprise site and additional work space for our vocational students to expand their working capabilities. This additional space will provide an efficient location for them to perfect their job skills and work on various employment tasks like screen printing, shredding confidential documents, fulfillment center for packaging and assembly, creating apparel and merchandise items, etc.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

JSA vocational students will provide services to the Northeast Florida community through a variety of outlets. They will provide confidential shredding services to local clients. They will sell apparel and merchandise to local vendors and individuals throughout the community. They will become a fulfillment and distribution center for clients both locally and nationally. They will grow, harvest, and sell locally-grown produce throughout local farmer's markets. The list will go on and on as our business opportunities to continue to expand through the use of additional funding and resources. Several enterprise options will be tested in an effort to solidify a long term sustainable funding model.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The group of people that this project will serve are students age 14 to adulthood. Program participants include current pre-vocation and vocation students at JSA as well as post-secondary students from other private and public programs. JSA serves populations of individuals with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). We enroll individuals from the surrounding counties of Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns. Our current placement of families crosses all ethnicities and economic backgrounds; autism does not discriminate by whose lives are impacted!

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of JSA's Vocational STEP Program is to essentially provide our vocational students with more and more job opportunities and supportive employment placements. Our students and young adults have the skills necessary to be successful and productive members in both their home and community; we just need to provide additional resources for them to be able to THRIVE! JSA uses a real time software program called Catalyst that help develop individual goals and programs and it has the capability to track skill development over multiple job coaching environments.
