### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to expand the MTL program that aims to increase graduation rates among minority students and increase industrial certification among high school students. The funds will also be utilized to conduct college tours within the state of Florida, exposing minority students to colleges and universities within the state.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The program has partnered with Take Stock in Children, Big Brothers and Big Sisters, and the Mourning Family Foundation, exposing participants to various cultural experiences. The following activities will be offered: Florida College Tours, Peer to Peer mentorships study hall programs, district-wide events, graduation workshops and assistance completing FAFSA applications.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

MTL parents, guardian and the community will attend monthly parent workshops to cover topics such as: graduation requirements, grading, stages of adolescences development and academic requirements.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The program currently serves over 10,000 students with the District. Upperclassmen with a 3.0 GPA or above who demonstrate leadership skills, are paired with lower-classmen who have earned less than 2.0 GPA for a two-year mentoring program. The additional funds will be used to expand this program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Participants in the program have an opportunity to interact with higher achieving high school and college students who serve as mentors and role models, thus helping students make a successful transition from high school to college and/or the workplace. The program also aims to increase graduation rates, particularly with minority males, to ensure success GPA and graduation rates.
