12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Great Explorations Children's Museum would like to bridge the gap when children and families advance from current learning demographics and move into higher education. While partnering with local educators, astronomers, public libraries, schools, and the neighborhood college, Great Explorations could stimulate learning through the continuum of care which will result in ultimate success of future leaders. Studies show that careers in STEM have grown 79% since the mid-1990s. Currently, Saint Petersburg has no science-focused informal learning organizations. The already existing location has a Title 1 middle school along its property line and with an existing relationship with Pinellas County Schools, Great Explorations would like to use the existing property to engage the middle and high school age children with the excitement of science in hopes to stimulate the need of STEAM in the community and future

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will be used solely to get the building located at 7701 22nd Ave N, Saint Petersburg repaired, renovated, and up to code. Great Explorations Children's Museum is prepared to seek private support or grant funding for other expenses.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Great Explorations Children's Museum will be providing science classes, hands on learning, and other programs to engage children in STEAM.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Children ages 6-13 in programming and young adults 14-18 through volunteer and intern programs. Although Great Explorations is inclusive to all children and families, Great Explorations would like to focus on serving low-income, at-risk, minority families and will be targeting Title 1 schools as well as their surrounding neighborhoods.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Great Explorations would like to increase engagement of advance education in children ages 6-13 with a focus on STEAM and to provide professional training and opportunities through internships and volunteer programs for children ages 14-18. Outcomes will be measured by working with Pinellas County Schools conducting surveys with the students before and after each visit to determine appropriate learning techniques. Great Explorations will work with teachers after visits to encourage continued learning of curriculum taught during their visits. Overall education will be evaluated on a quarterly basis for all long term programs. Measuring educational outcomes at the beginning, middle, and end to ensure certain learning marks are being met. These evaluation measures will allow Great Explorations to adapt all programs as needed to ensure the best outcomes possible.
