12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to build a permanent camp structure so we may facilitate activities that will develop character, produce hope and provide opportunities for at-risk inner-city youth. At Camp Deep Pond we are developing character in youth, helping them achieve social, emotional and physical wellness. We strive to reduce the tendencies of youth to be involved in violence, and provide ample opportunities for youth to grow exponentially. From building self-esteem and confidence to providing healthy nutrition and amazing outdoor activities, we offer a range of opportunities for kids to develop healthy habits for life. Ultimately, our goal of this funding request is to be able to build a permanent camp facility so we may comfortably and safely provide the programs and services necessary to help young people, especially those who need us most, reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

BGCNF will provide a true summer camp experience in an outdoor setting to thousands of at-risk inner-city youth each year. Upon receiving funds, Boys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Florida will build a multi-purpose activity center for youth at Camp Deep Pond. Camp services and activities will include character development, team-building challenges, archery, science and technology (STEM rocket program), biking, kayaking, swimming, and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FFWCC) "Project Wild" and "Project Aquatic Wild" curriculum, and BGCNF's "Ultimate Journey" curriculum. By acquiring needed funds to build Camp Deep Pond's permanent structures, we will continue to provide our excellent, life-changing activities and services safely and effectively to a larger population of at-risk, inner city youth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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With the recent addition of Camp Deep Pond to BGCNF, we increased Club participation to thousands of at-risk innercity youth. Direct services include transportation, healthy meals and snacks, personal character and team development lessons, outdoor adventure and educational opportunities for personal growth and discovery, at a true camp setting that many youth have never experienced before. Our goal is to reduce violence, increase education and hope, and help young people reach their full potential. Our camp staff is currently pursuing training provided by the American Camping Association, Florida Youth Network, and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. New, permanent structures are essential to maximizing the impact our services have on our camp population.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is at-risk youth ages 6 to 18 who currently live in the inner-city. We seek to serve over 2,000 youth during summer and many more during the school year. These youth typically reside in low-income households with over 90% of them participating in the free or reduced-fee lunch program at their school. Without BGCNF providing the summer camp experience at Camp Deep Pond, these youth would never have the opportunity to experience the joys of the great outdoors. Children and youth outside of BGCNF are always welcomed and encouraged to enjoy our services at Camp Deep Pond. We strive to accommodate and provide services for all young people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Our goal is to ensure that the youth who spend their time with us are achieving social, emotional and physical wellness. From building self-esteem and confidence to providing healthy snacks and activities, we offer a range of opportunities for kids to develop healthy habits for life. Additionally, BGCNF will build permanent structures at Camp Deep Pond to include a multi-purpose activity center, restrooms, hydration stations, ropes course, restrooms, pole barn, nature/conservation education center and accommodations for various young people. We strive to reduce neighborhood violence, increase educational opportunities and provide hope to all young people.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

BGCNF fully expects to successfully implement the deliverables of this project. Should BGCNF fail to meet any aspect of the deliverables, an appropriate portion of funding could be returned.
