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We continually seek alternative funding for the Parent Aide program. Our primary source of funding for the agency is an annual Awards Luncheon at UNF and donations from local private foundations, businesses and individuals. We continue to apply through all local funding sources: United Way, city and county governments. In addition, DCF Assistant Secretary Medlock has indicated that DCF recognizes the need for enhanced prevention funding and Parent Aide will apply for any new funding opportunity.

We were granted \$150,000 from the City of Jacksonville for CARES funding, however, we were only allowed to use the funds for expenses incurred July 1 - Oct 30 2020 and are in process of returning \$63,950.54 to the City. We also received \$21,000 in PPP funding.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Fewer children will be removed from their homes for abuse and neglect, ultimately reducing the number of children in Foster Care. Families who enroll in the program will receive 6 - 12 months of in-home case management and parent education services in their own home. The goal is to help parents learn and cultivate the skills and practices necessary to provide a safe, stable and nurturing environment for their children and reduce the potential of the children being removed from their homes by DCF. These referrals are for families deemed at "low" or "moderate" risk of abuse and no other intensive in-home services are available to the individuals we serve. The CBC offers services only to families deemed "high" risk and Healthy Families, also an in-home program, enrolls expectant moms and parents of newborns under 3 mo's. The Parent Aide program as well as the Nurturing Parenting curriculum are both evidenced based and time tested programs in use for over 40 years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Weekly one hour visits to the family home during the initial 3 - 6 months, bi-weekly for a period of 6 - 9 months thereafter. All workbooks and curriculum are provided without cost. Families are also provided with various available resources for emergency needs such as food, medicine and other items that the families may struggle to afford. Interactions between the parents and the children are observed during the visits. Families may also earn small incentive rewards for active participation, maintaining homework assignments and completing the entire course. All curriculum is determined by the needs of the family through an Assessment tool which assists the Parent Aide is identifying family/individual strengths and areas in need of improvement. A pre and post-test ("AAPI") is utilized determine parents' understanding of the material. Goals are also established for each adult enrolled as well as goals for the family, all of which they are expected to meet during enrollment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Parent Aide program will be offered to families identified by DCF Investigators across Duval and Nassau counties; referrals may also be accepted from law enforcement and Dept. of Corrections. All Parent Aide services are provided on a voluntary basis and there is no cost to participants regardless of income. Families are accepted without regard to the age of the children and does not limit enrollment to 0 - 3 as done with other prevention programs which is the reason for the programs popularity. All adults living in the household who may provide care for the child are offered services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target population is any family reported to DCF or law enforcement with allegations of child abuse or neglect. If parent(s) is deemed at risk of child abuse or neglect but the children are not assessed as 'unsafe', the PI may refer the family to Parent Aide before DCF case closure. The local CBC provides such services only to families deemed at "imminent risk for removal" of the child per the Families First Prevention Services Act and low or moderate risk families do not qualify for their programs. Healthy Families also provides excellent and very similar services, however, only expectant moms and families with a newborn under the age of 3 months may enroll in Healthy Families, therefore, all other families are referred to Parent Aide in these counties. With the \$250,000 requested we will provide services to 70 families which constitutes approximately 170 children and 100 adults. The annual cost per child is \$1,488 as opposed to \$40,000 - \$80,000 per child per year for foster care.

If the required number of families are not served or specific requirements are not met, we will work with DCF to return funds received under this contract.
