Purchase of two (2) high capacity, mobile, stormwater pumps to assist SBDD is pumping stormwater out of critically affected (flooded) areas after a major rain event. The pumps will also serve as back-up pumps at SBDD's seven (7) stormwater pump stations in the event of a shutdown or catastrophic failure at one of those pump stations.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The high capacity mobile pumps will allow SBDD to reduce the duration of flooding after major storm events. These pumps could be deployed anywhere throughout SBDD's jurisdictional boundaries. After TS Eta there were many critical areas that could have benefited from these pumps. The pumps will also serve as emergency back-up pumps for SBDD's 7 stormwater pump stations, which will be a huge benefit.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

SBDD will custom design the pumps (in-house) and secure the pumps through a competitive bidding process. Once the pumps are secured, SBDD will deploy and utilize these pumps whenever and wherever the need arises.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The citizens of SBDD will receive a higher level of service for drainage and flood protection; they will have a higher degree of emergency back-up equipment in place; the project will allow SBDD to reduce flooding in critical areas after a major storms allow citizens to return back to their normal, daily activities; and finally, the project will help to reduce property damage from flooding.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will benefit the entire residential and business population of SBDD; approximately 250,000 residents and over 5,000 businesses.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The measurable outcome will be the delivery and possession by SBDD of 2 high-capacity, mobile stormwater pumps.

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None at this time, as SBDD's standard bidding and contract language have strong penalties for nonperformance.
