4. Project/Program Description

The current Records Management System in use is extremely outdated and antiquated. The software is more than 20 years old and due to this outdated software is no longer compatible with current Windows and Microsoft software used by modern law enforcement agencies in the State of Florida. Officers currently can't properly write and save police reports and the Records Section currently cannot archive offense reports. Due to the outdated nature of the current software police investigators are unable to query. The proposed project (SmartCOP) will allow the Quincy Police Department to upgrade its current system and afford its Police Officers and Records Dept. employees the ability to effectively and proficiently manipulate a RMS system which is compatible with other agencies, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Federal Bureau of Investigations for annual and bi-annual crimes tabulations for Uniform Crime Reports and the new FIBRS tabulation system.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Police Department mission is to partner with the community to ensure that Quincy is a safe community and to prevent crime. With a Records Management System replacement, this will allow the Quincy Police Department to operate more efficient and effective and allow police officers to write police offense reports much quicker without unnecessary system crashes and failures. SmartCOP will allow police officers to spend more time in the community performing community policing functions and preventing crime, resulting in a projected reduction in crime statistics.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new replacement Records Management System (SmartCOP) will allow the Quincy Police Department to better serve our community by 1)The Records Unit will be able to locate police reports much easier and thus provide records and information to both citizens, other law enforcement agencies, state and nationwide in a more timely and effective manner. The RMS will allow our officers to better provide our community quicker response times and quicker reporting of offense and traffic crash reports with a more reliable system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Citizens expect timely responses, safety, and professional actions and best practices. The replacement Records Management System will allow the Quincy Police Department to better serve our community by 1)The Records Unit being able to locate archived police reports much easier and thus provide them to both citizens and other law enforcement agencies. The RMS will allow our officers to better provide our community quicker response times and quicker, correct and finished offense and traffic crash reports with a more reliable system. This will create a sense of community that is perceived to be safer and projects a more professional and business approach to the necessary paperwork.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the entire citizen population of the City of Quincy which is approximately 7,914 citizens. The city also has approximately 200 businesses that includes large employers, such as Walmart and a growing medical marijuana company named Trulieve, in addition to a major food distributor, UNFI (These mentioned companies employ over 300 employees).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is a reduction in Part I and Part II crimes. The methodology for measuring this reduction will be the annual and semi annual Uniform Crime Reports sent to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and to the FBI. This is also monitored with monthly department productivity reports.
