The Little Wekiva River is located on the west side Seminole County and is designated an Outstanding Florida Water (OFW). The restoration project is planned to begin north of Springs Landing Bridge and end south of SR46 downstream the confluence of the Big and Little Wekiva Rivers. The restoration is approximately 7,000 LF in length and approximate 20 acres in total. This multi-agency, multi-jurisdictional project would provide much needed maintenance and restoration the Little Wekiva River (LWR) in this area. Proposed project activities will include the harvesting of invasive plant islands removal of deposited sediments within the river, re-contouring of historic meanders, and replanting with beneficial native plant species. The excess accumulated sediments and vegetation are causing the river to spread out further into the floplain and increase residential, commercial and municipal flooding potential. 5.
