Upgrades to the Coy Burgess Loop Watermain would provide a main water transmission line from the well located on Coy Burgess Loop to US-331. This line would support growth in this area and provide for capacity for future development in this area.

New commercial and residential developments and new mixed use developments can be created due to providing the needed water main connection.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The construction project would provide immediate job opportunities for the entire area as it would require utility crews and landscape and irrigation workers to complete the area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Many individuals who live and visit the region would benefit from this project. Some that would be immediately impacted are those individuals impacted are those individuals who are unemployed or economically disadvantaged by the economic impact resulting in new jobs in the food, lodging and retail industries.
