### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project proposes to address the need for this rapidly growing rural region to provide a multi-use/multi-purpose, collaborative workspace/center linking education and business and industry and focused on meeting the talent supply and workforce development needs of the area. The facility will provide four classrooms and be equipped with resources for use by students enrolled in the STEAM Magnet 9-12 Innovation Academy (computer sciences, engineering pathways, biomedical sciences) for postsecondary students enrolling in IT and business, and for business and industry along with the general public/job seekers and economic development.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project proposes to construct a state of the art facility space for education and training that will focus on providing STEAM/STEM training and industry certification including computer sciences, engineering pathways, biomedical sciences, and business/IT for 9-12 and postsecondary (technical college) students and will offer re-skilling and up-skilling for adults entering/already in the workforce. The facility will provide accommodations for community resources, leadership development, and collaborative workspaces that bring together learners and teachers, including business/industry/entrepreneurship.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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This region is one of the fastest growing in the state. To meet the growing need for a readily available talent supply, rigorous courses in computer science, engineering pathways, biomedical sciences, and business/IT will be provided along with preparation for appropriate industry certification for students. Courses and programs to train/retrain area workers for currently needed skills will be offered by the technical college along with area businesses. The multi-purpose facility will directly connect education and workforce development activities and provide meeting spaces and connection to community resources that support the development of a vibrant and resilient economy in the region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population(s) to be served by this project include secondary (9-12) STEAM students and postsecondary technical college students, state college/university education providers, along with business and industry and the general community. The project expects that 200-400+ individuals will be served in the first year of operation, with that number increasing each subsequent year as the facility is used more extensively by the general public, business and industry, postsecondary education, and community organizations.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The primary benefit of the project is the development of talent to meet the growing labor force demands of the region. Talent development will include connecting college and career ready students with business and industry along with reskilling and up-skilling of the current labor force and support for entrepreneurship in the area. Facility use will be documented as to the name of the business/agency/ person(s) using the facility and the purpose for which the facility is being used.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Proposed penalties for failure to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract include: withholding of funds and liquidation of damages.

Walton County School Board would receive the capital outlay funds for construction and renovation of facilities located on property leased from St. Joe Corporation (10 year lease with option to renew).
