#### 4. Project/Program Description

Peck High School was built in 1927 as part of the Rosenwald Schools program which constructed approximately 5,000 schools in the south from 1912-1932, primarily for the education of African American children. The school was named after William Peck, one of the early principals and champions of African American education in Fernandina Beach, who the University of Florida decreed "among the Great Floridians of the state." Called "Peck Center" today, the school is one of the few remaining Rosenwald Schools. Today, the Peck Center remains located within a predominantly black community initially populated with Peck High School's African American teachers. Its history is commemorated with a Florida State historic marker, and the building is a community cornerstone and home to City offices, non-profits, classes and activities, and recreation.

#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose and goal is to repair and restore the original exterior brick which is causing structural leaks, mold, and other interior and exterior damage. The water intrusion through the porous aged brick and damaged mortar, with the attendant peeling paint and mold growth, is increasingly occurring throughout the historic building. The wear of its original ninety-three year old brick exterior and mortar requires expensive, yet critically needed repairs, to remain in a functional condition.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The 93 year old building will be pressure washed; Tuck Point 100% of facade, approx. 64,757 lineal fee (Tuck Point Repair); replace approx. 50 shelf lintels where deteriorated metal can't be repaired; replace approx. 500 broken bricks; replace approx. 1500 lineal ft. of deteriorated window sealant; repair fractured cast stone accents; and apply a special, clear non-glass sealer which has been approved by the FDOS Bureau of Historic Preservation to entire facade.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Peck Center houses city offices, is used by non-profit organizations, and holds different types of classes, activities, and recreation for the children and adults within the community.

The building is open 40 hours per week and is managed by one paid staff member in order to keep the door open to the citizens of Fernandina Beach.



#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Some 85,000 Nassau County citizens, but especially the African American community, those with disabilities, the elderly, school children, college students, homeless, at-risk youth, economically disadvantaged, mentally, and physically disabled. The resources at the Peck Center have so much to offer every citizen.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The new preservation and education activities will help reintroduce Peck Center's noble past to both old and new generations and ensure that its history remains accessible to future generations.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables would result in the cancellation of the contract and forfeiture of remaining balance of unspent appropriation.
