The City Boynton Beach plans to revitalize the Martin Luther King Jr. corridor through a design of mixed-use residential and commercial uses targeted to benefit the local neighborhoods. The stormwater management improvements will allow for the treatment of stormwater runoff to meet or exceed state discharge standards. The infrastructure improvements will also address historical neighborhood drainage issues.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Infrastructure improvements that include a new stormwater management system to address historical drainage issues while also accommodating new mixed-use residential and commercial redevelopment. The stormwater infrastructure will provide treated stormwater runoff that will meet or exceed state discharge standards.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Heart of Boynton neighborhood is the target population to be served with an estimated 4,481 individuals. This neighborhood is located within an Opportunity Zone and is in process of a revitalization featuring mixed-use residential and commercial redevelopment planned.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The Martin Luther King Jr. corridor through a design of mixed-use residential and commercial uses targeted to benefit the local neighborhoods and businesses will require infrastructure improvements throughout the area. Infrastructure improvements include a new stormwater management system to address historical drainage issues while also accommodating the new development. The reduction in the level of crime in the area, meeting state standards to reduce pollution and improve surface water quality, and the quantities of stormwater runoff conveyed and treated by the new stormwater infrastructure will all be used to measure the benefits and outcomes of the project.
