4. Project/Program Description

This project involves demolition and replacement of an old concrete highway bridge, which is functioning as a public pier, with a new wooden fishing pier. The Manatee River is a major tributary to Tampa Bay and located between the cities of Palmetto and Bradenton. The pier is a popular local fishing amenity and important to the tourist economy of the area. The old concrete structure is no longer sound and the bridge needs to be decommissioned and demolished by 2022. Full replacement is slated to be completed in 2025. Bridge demolition debris will be utilized to enhance a fully permitted artificial fishing reef site located 16 miles from the bridge.

#### 12. Program Performance

##### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Planning, design, engineering, and permitting for the replacement of an old concrete highway bridge, which is functioning as a public pier, with a new wooden fishing pier. The old concrete structure is no longer sound and in 1986 it was recommended that the bridge be decommissioned and demolished within 25 years or by 2011. Bridge demolition debris will be utilized to enhance a fully permitted artificial fishing reef site located 16 miles from the bridge.

##### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Planning and design, engineering, and permitting for the replacement of a fishing pier in Manatee County.

##### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Recreational opportunities for local citizens and the direct benefit from increased tourism tax dollars coming to small business charter boat fishing captains and recreational dive boats.

##### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General citizenry, recreational fishers, and attendees of fishing festivals with an estimated attendance of 5,000 - 10,000 per year.

##### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The project will contribute to improved fishing and recreational opportunities, sales tax, and tourism revenue in an urbanized area and is expected to have a positive economic impact on Manatee County measured in terms of increased tourist revenue. It is expected that quantitative success criteria will be developed for recreational amenities and public recreational use statistics. Manatee County will create a detailed monitoring program that will address data collection and assessment methodologies. The county is committed to conducting monitoring to quantify benefits.

Withholding of funding.
