### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Allow economically disadvantaged individuals, due to the unfamiliarity to the English language, the opportunity to learn the basic English language skills that could catapult them to a new level of prosperity while enhancing their social adaptation through artistic expression.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The program is designed to provide beginners to intermediate English language decency accompanied with prerecorded art courses in drawing, painting, design, music history, and magic. The recorded lessons would be available by students from any location and device with Internet connectivity. Students will be required to complete weekly quizzes that will be monitored by our faculty.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Online English as a Second Language lessons through art integration.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Non-English speakers residing within Florida District 11. We expect to serve 800+ individuals. Nonetheless, this number can be larger by forming study groups at churches or community centers.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Weekly quizzes will allow teachers to monitor the English increase and skill in students taking the courses while having the opportunity to offer feedback to students. As of in the case of the Covid-19, our courses will permit the proper propagation of safety measures in future health emergencies. Additionally, an individual with a different language background other than English will have the inability to pursue higher education goals, but our program could help. By monitoring their advancements in developing basic communication skills (reading, hearing, speaking, and writing), we can help non-English speaking. individuals pursue higher education goals and better integration to society
