### 4. Project/Program Description

On July 17, 1821, General Andrew Jackson oversaw the exchange of flags in Pensacola as Florida formally passed from Spanish to American possession. Through a community-wide effort, the state and local community can commemorate this important event in local, state, and national history. While a major event will take place on Saturday, July 17, 2021, this is only one of the multiple events and projects that is anticipated will comprise this celebration. A number of events and programs will commemorate individuals and groups of people and their roles in the Americanization of Pensacola and Florida. Music, literature, art, technology, science, government, history, archaeology, architecture, and more all contribute to ways in which Pensacola's multi-cultural community evolved from a Spanish frontier town into an American city. Pensacola has one of the richest cultural heritages of any city in the United States and has a multi-layered story to tell.

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This exciting commemoration is an excellent opportunity to reach a broad audience, not only in Pensacola but also across the state, region, and nation. Instilling pride in their community, state, and nation. Educating citizens on their history as well as attracting tourists to the area that contribute to the local economy. Various civic and non-profit groups will participate in the celebration creating an economic benefit to local advertisers, vendors, and various food service workers.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire community including local schoolchildren as well as cultural heritage tourists who will come to the area to participate in the celebration. Through media coverage as well as with actual event attendance, the city expects to reach over 500,000 people.

The direct benefit will be educational. This celebration will allow the community to better understand the history of how Florida became a part of the United States. There will also be an economic benefit to the events surrounding this celebration and it will attract tourists who are interested in history and heritage. These tourists will stay in hotels, eat in restaurants, visit attractions, shop in stores, and buy gas at filling stations which will directly benefit the local economy.
