#### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

With less than 10 percent of foster youth graduating from college, foster youth are in need of targeted guidance and support for career preparation. The purpose of the funds being requested is to establish a career and technical college designed to meet the unique needs of children in Florida's child welfare and dependency system. It is expected that this will not only be the first of it's kind in the state of Florida, but also nationally.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to provide a career and technical college for youth in Florida's child welfare and dependency system. While admission criteria includes all youth in the dependency system, the focus of the project is to target foster youth who can not be placed with traditional foster families or group homes because of mental health, complex trauma or juvenile justice s involvement. Students will reside at the campus, receive comprehensive mental health treatment services, and earn a career certificate, diploma or degree.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The expected outcomes for the citizens includes a reduced cost of public assistance to support foster youth aging out of the system. Data shows a disproportionate rate of homeless foster children. By providing foster youth with a trained skilled, career development, and transition assistance, they become a self-sufficient productive member of society, significantly less reliant upon government assistance.

## d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Foster youth who can not be placed with traditional foster families or group homes because of mental health, complex trauma or juvenile justice involvement.



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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits of the project include decreased rates of homelessness of Foster Care youth aging out of the system, increased rates of post-secondary education attainment of Foster Care youth aging out of the system, increased rates of employment of Foster Care youth aging out of the system. Methodology: "eligible youth" = youth that completed the program who aged out of Foster Care. Homelessness: # of eligible youth who were not homeless post release/# of eligible youth. Post-Secondary attainment: # of eligible youth who earned an industry certification, diploma, or degree/# of eligible youth. Employment: # of eligible youth who maintained employment/# of eligible youth.

Jackson Oaks, LLC is the owner of the facility that will received the fixed capital outlay funding. Twin Oaks Juvenile Development, Inc., a Florida 501(c)(3), has executed a 20-year lease on the property that will house the Waypoint Career and Technical College for meeting the educational needs of its students. Any fixed capital outlay funding will be exclusively to the benefit of Waypoint Career and Technical College to enhance and operate the school more efficiently.
