12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Veterans Alternative's goal is to provide Florida Veterans and Active Duty Military with increased access to Accelerated Resolution Therapy (ART) and other alternative therapies that effectively treat symptoms and issues related to trauma, post-traumatic stress, anxiety, depression and more. Through alternative therapies, Veterans Alternative will help veterans and active duty military members live a more healthy, connected and resilient life after experiencing the traumas of war.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Veterans Alternative provides highly effective therapies including Accelerated Resolution Therapy, adaptive yoga, Integrative Restoration (iRest) and art therapy. Services are provided through two delivery formats including the five-day Accelerated Wellness Program (AWP) or on an individualized services basis. By providing services through both formats, the organization is increasing accessibility for those unable to attend a five-day program. Both models allow participants to experience proven therapies and become more healthy, connected and resilient.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include Accelerated Resolution Therapy, adaptive yoga, iRest, and art therapy.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will provide services to 150 Florida Veterans and/or Active Duty Military Members dealing with issues related to post-traumatic stress, anxiety and depression due to the traumas of war.



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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Veterans and Active Duty Military Members who participate in either service delivery format will experience a reduction in trauma related to PTSD, depression, anxiety and stress. In addition, they will experience an increase in resiliency and community engagement. Pre- and Post- assessments are conducted as part of service delivery and use valid and reliable measures of psychological and physical health. Examples of measures used include the Post-Traumatic Checklist (PCL-5), the Brief Symptom Inventory (BSI), and the Pain Outcomes Quest. An external evaluator, KMS Research, then uses the data collected to perform an extensive analysis to produce a comprehensive program evaluation on overall service impact.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Veterans Alternative will work with the department on a corrective action plan to improve service delivery as outlined in state contract.
