12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will support structural improvements to historic sites in Florida connected to African American history and the civil rights movement. Additionally, archives and collections at the historic sites will be digitized and preserved for future generations. Marketing will elevate the brand of the sites through national promotions. Targeted sites are understaffed and funds will be used to support salaries and benefits.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Many historic sites connected to African American history are more than 50 years old and are deteriorating. Structural enhancements will stabilize the facilities and allow for public access.

Developing the targeted sites as tourist attractions will generate tax dollars for the State of Florida. Festivals draw major audiences to tourist locations and will be promoted.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will expand the choices that citizens have to experience authentic activities, culture, artifacts and places connected to ethnic heritage and black cultural tourism. The Travel Industry of America highlighted that individuals who participate in cultural tourism engage in longer stays at destinations where they can experience cuisine, shopping, and stories about people of the past. This project will also create jobs and elevate property values in historic communities. Hotel occupancy will increase and Florida's tourism offerings will help to diversify the state's economy.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Meeting planners, travel destination coordinators, family reunions, senior tour participants, students, and individuals interested in ethnic and cultural tourism are among the target population to be served by this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

Increased tourism, job creation, higher property values, and strengthened historic structures will be outcomes of this project. Baseline data on ethnic and cultural tourism will be used to determine if projected increases have occurred. Data will be collected from tourists at targeted sites and during festivals.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Clawback provisions will be possible penalties if deliverables or performance measures provided in the contracts are not met.

These organizations will be targeted to be involved in the Sankofa Black Cultural Tourism Enhancement Project.
