4. Project/Program Description

The Davidson road paving improvements project would provide a paved roadway from the Holmes County line to CR 280 (Douglas Ferry Road) in Washington County. Davidson Road is currently unpaved and has very high traffic. Recently, Holmes Correctional Institution, Holmes County Jail and Workcamp, Arnold Lumber Company, and some residences were only accessible by Davidson Road due to a bridge outage on Thomas Drive. The traffic types and volumes that fed Davidson Road during that time caused safety concerns for the entire area and the road was used as a seven mile detour to the Holmes County Jail and Workcamps. The proposed project would provide paved access from both counties to the residential, commercial, and institutional land uses mentioned. Additionally, a paved access would be provided to Doctors Memorial Hospital from Washington County to reduce emergency response times across the county line.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The proposed project would provide a paved roadway from Thomas Dr in Holmes County to CR 280 (Douglas Ferry Rd) in Washington County. Davidson Rd is currently unpaved. Recently, Holmes Correctional Institution, Holmes County Jail and Workcamp, Arnold Lumber Company, and some residences were only accessible by Davidson Rd due to a bridge outage on Thomas Dr. Traffic that fed Davidson Rd while the bridge was out was a safety concern for the area. This project would provide paved access from both counties.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Engineering and inspection services and utilization of various construction vendors would be required to complete the project and ensure funds are spent in the most beneficial way to address the needed improvements. The project would provide a new paved surface with signage and striping and a drainage system to improve safety along an existing unpaved roadway.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project would provide a paved access from both Washington and Holmes counties to Holmes Correctional Institution, Holmes County Jail and Workcamp, Arnold Lumber Company, and some residences. Additionally, the proposed project would provide an additional paved access to Doctors Memorial Hospital and would reduce emergency response times.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents and businesses within both Washington County and Holmes County would benefit. It is expected the project would serve more than 800 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved response times for emergency services would be a health benefit. Minimizing logging routes to the lumber mill would be an agricultural benefit. Improved traffic conditions would be a benefit. Construction would provide immediate job opportunities for the entire area. Improved stormwater management and surface water quality would be provided by minimizing discharge across the roadway and sedimentation into adjacent wetlands. These benefits would be measured by surveying time travel for medical personnel to respond to emergency situations/911, surveying time travel for logging trucks and lumber suppliers, evaluating county maintenance and repair costs pre- and post-construction, performing workforce interviews to determine the number of individuals employed by construction, and preparing a stormwater model to evaluate the existing and proposed drainage network as a way to quantify the outcome of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The county would award the contract through a bid process. The bid documents would address how liquidated damages for project overruns would be handled. The contractor would incur a cost per day for each day following a due date or construction delay which exceeds the contract timeline. The bid documents would require that the contractor provide performance and payments bonds, and a 10% retainer would be withheld to ensure issues are resolved or corrected in a timely fashion.
