#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) use a multidisciplinary approach to serve child victims that coordinates trauma informed services in a child centered environment.

Funding for the CACs will improve and expand the consolidation of community investigative, legal and social service programs necessary to deliver services to children who are victims of physical and sexual abuse, children who witness violent crime or domestic violence and victims of trafficking, children who are victims of neglect or who are endangered due to drugs or alcohol and their families or non offending caregivers.

During FY 2019-20, the CACs provided services to 20,156 unduplicated children.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The CACs coordinate and facilitate the Multidisciplinary Teams in their community which include but are not limited to law enforcement, prosecution, child protective services, medical, mental health and victim advocate services. The services provided by the CACs include trauma assessments, case management, forensic and specialized interviews, mental health therapy, medical exams and referrals to community agencies.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services to child victims and their non offending caregivers include:

therapy, medical exams, psychological evaluations, for ensic and specialized interviews, case management, crisis intervention and referrals to community services.

These services not only assist victims and their families directly but support the work of other agencies including law enforcement prosecution and other community agencies serving victims.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are children who are victims of physical and sexual abuse, trafficking victims, witness to crime and drug endangered and who witness domestic violence.

It is anticipated that the CACs will serve more than 20,000 unduplicated victims.



# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The child victims and their families will receive the necessary services, including crisis intervention, mental health treatment, case management, medical exams and referrals to community agencies. The CACs provide monthly financial invoices, data reports and are monitored - historically onsite monitoring, however, this year monitoring activities were virtual.

The CACs also collect satisfaction surveys from families.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The current standard penalties provided for in the existing contract are adequate.
