This is emergency traffic light located on SR 188 will serve the citizens of the community continuously and on many levels. It will enable emergency vehicles to enter the state road safely and make the occurrence of a vehicle accident less likely. It will also improve response time by getting response vehicles on the state road quicker and on the scene of the emergency faster. This project consists of taking complete control of the intersection of Racetrack Road and Jackson/Washington Street on SR 188. The project will use preemptive equipment with two signal poles and four mast arms in order to control traffic when there is a need for emergency response. The FDOT has completed all the engineering work and permits for the construction of the project. Okaloosa County has permitted the project and will oversee the construction. The project is truly shovel ready. The Ocean City - Wright Fire Control District has \$150,000.00 matching funding for the project
