Riviera Beach Utility Special District (RBUSD) is planning to replace over 60 years old 16-inch water main that is located partially under the sea floor, but some of the main is exposed to water in the intracoastal and at risk for being damaged, such as by anchors. The replacement main would ensure that pressure is maintained during fire flow and peak hour flow conditioned. Only 1 other main is available to serve residents, thus this project would improve resiliency of the system. This phase of the project will focus on preconstruction activities such as survey and design, followed by construction in the next phase regarding future funding requests.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Riviera Beach Utility Special District (RBUSD) is planning to replace the over 50 year old water main that is located partially under the sea floor. Some of the main is exposed to water in the intracoastal and at risk for being damaged, such as by anchors. The replacement main would ensure that pressure is maintained during fire flow and peak hour flow conditions. An existing 14-inch main is available to serve residents at Singer Island but if the 16-inch main were to fail low pressures were predicted by model simulations, thus this project would improve resiliency of the system.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of a new water main in the intracoastal to service Singer Island customers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Drinking water service that is more resilient.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately 7,400 customers served by RBUSD at Singer Island as well as thousands of visitors annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduced likelihood of water main failure and resulting low pressure and disruption to service continuity. Reliability of critical waterway crossings and service pressures would be enhanced. Monitoring system pressures maintained on Singer Island; record drawings of proposed improvements.
