Improve physical health: Offers more than 257,000 daytime users and 92,000 residents an active community environment. The number of households in the Greater Downtown area more than doubled between 2000 and 2014 and trends anticipate adding more than 12,000 new residents within the next five years. Methodology: Economic benefits of improved health from engaging in regular physical activity can be valued as the avoided reduction in productivity that results from that activity. Lost economic output from people being out of work or not engaged while at work represents the social cost in this model. 1) the amount of time spent at the Baywalk exercising. 2) the cost per minute of lost opportunity. Enrich cultural experience: Miami Baywalk and Riverwalk will be a critical link to Perez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), Frost Science Center, American Airlines Arena, Bayside Marketplace.
