4. Project/Program Description

To be able to meet the increasing demand for programs and activities, TLNC is working to build an ADA accessible. environmentally sustainable education complex. This complex will house an interpretive natural history museum, additional indoor classrooms, an outdoor covered and screened teaching space, a small meeting room, and outdoor accessible bathrooms. In addition, parking for 100 cars with a safe loading and unloading area for school buses is included in the plan. As it is anticipated that Florida will be fully open this year, the time to build is now.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Provide nature-based education for the region, visitors, and students. To expand programs and increase audience, TLNC needs to build additional classrooms (indoor and outdoor), replace the aging natural history museum trailer, improve the road and parking system, provide outdoor ADA accessible bathrooms, and add a meeting room. Construction will also allow for a nature play area for smaller children and provide additional space to offer overlapping programs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construct indoor and outdoor teaching areas, new natural history museum, outdoor accessible restrooms, small community meeting space, and additional exhibit and education storage with administrative offices. It would include relocating the maintenance work area and developing a low-impact parking area.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Serving as the only nature center in Lake County, TLNC will be able to expand education programs and events and add new programs. Having an updated and improved interpretive natural history museum will benefit visitors' learning. Concurrent programs will be possible and business retreats, professional development training, and ecotherapy programs can be expanded.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



In 2019, 10,568 students, adults, and families participated in TLNC's environmental education programs and over 13,544 visitors walked the trails, visiting the museum and exhibits. The outreach programs worked with 3,385 people. With all programs, activities, and outreach, TLNC interacted with and educated approximately 27,500 people. In 2020, 19,681 people visited the site with education numbers being reduced because of COVID-19 but outreach maintaining at 3,359. Although interactions were different, TLNC still educated and provided services to 24,555 people in 2020.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Programs are evaluated using quantitative and qualitative methods, visitation is tracked, participant numbers recorded, and online reviews are used.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

TLNC would expect typical penalties to apply.
