12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Farmers Fresh Invest (FFI) is a statewide social and economic enterprise by Treasure Coast Food Bank seeking matching state funds to serve more of Florida's families. FFI partners with family farms in Florida, operates a bulk food production center, produces a skilled workforce through job training, and has created a successful self-sustaining venture working side by side with the private sector.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Farmers Fresh Invest expands markets for state-wide growers-especially family farms, reduces food waste which harms our land, water, and climate. Created to expand growers distribution markets, the project links Florida farmers with individuals and families seeking fresh, nutritious fruits and veggies, expands nutrition programs for citizens living within known food desert areas, creates cost savings for school systems participating in Farm2School.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Farmers Fresh Invest provides multiple direct services to citizens including more equitable access to fresh produce and nutrition education for 100,000 food insecure individuals (including food deserts), 60,000 students (USDA Farm2School and Florida CFSP), and SNAP and non-SNAP households. Additionally 20 new jobs will be created upon expansion of project and dozens of viable job readiness candidates will be trained annually.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, students and Florida grower and food insecure families.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve physical health, Improve agriculture production/ promotion/ education, improve economic activity, create immediate job opportunities, enhance specific individual's economic self sufficiency and economic development.
