## 4. Project/Program Description

The Town of Davie and Central Broward Water Control District conducted a drainage study of the Shenandoah community, a neighborhood of 1 square mile and over 5,000 residents. The study concluded that the community needs a pump station for its outfall to its primary canal, the North New River, to reduce water levels pre- and post-storm. The Town is currently funding the design and permitting for this pump station. This request would fund the construction of the pump. The project will improve drainage capacity and enhance water treatment to comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) standards.

#### 12. Program Performance

##### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

With the recent rainfall from Tropical Storm Eta, this area amongst others in the Town of Davie were flooded and streets left impassable for residents and public safety personnel. This project proposes to improve the drainage infrastructure in the Shenandoah Community. Our goal is to be proactive regarding the issue of flooding within this neighborhood before it poses more undue hardship on the residents.

##### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project propose to construct a pump station for the Shenandoah community outfall to its primary canal, the North New River, to reduce water levels pre and post storm. This project will fund the design, permitting, and construction of drainage improvements to reduce potential flooding in the Shenandoah Community. As Floridians, we have to contend with the rainy season which coincides with hurricane season. During Tropical Storm Eta, portions of the Town (including this area) received close to 15 inches of rain.

##### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will construct a pump station for outfall to the primary canal (the North New River) and drainage improvements to reduce potential flooding in the community.

##### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The project will assist residents residing in and around the Shenandoah Community. There are approximately 5,000 residents residing within that area.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The project will improve drainage capacity, enhance water treatment, reduce water levels pre and post storm, and alleviate flooding issues that prohibits residents from entering and leaving the community during a heavy rainstorm. This poses a public safety concerns for those who require assistance.

The Town would consider requiring liquidated damages if the project was not completed within the project timeline.
