4. Project/Program Description

The College has more than 72,000 square feet of space constructed more than 33 years ago, making the facilities among the oldest in the Florida College System.

Many roofs on the Leesburg Čampus have exceeded their life expectancy by 15-20 years and are well beyond their useful life due to significant deferred maintenance.

Hurricane Irma, further accelerated the degradation of the aging roofs and building structures.

Several roofs require significant repair or replacement to preserve building integrity. HVAC systems are also beyond their life expectancy and prone to sudden and unexpected failures, a direct impact on student satisfaction and performance. The higher moisture levels caused from these failures further compromise the the building structures and system. Updated controls and building re commissioning is necessary to stabilize the air quality, improve energy efficiency and provide an appropriate learning environment.

As today's students increasingly expect a modern experience and courses integrate more technology and on-line components, campus facilities must evolve to meet these requirements. Unfortunately, LSSC has not been able to renovate facilities to meet the needs of today's students. Instead, many of our facilities create a detrimental and unwelcoming student experience.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to make the necessary roof and HVAC repairs to prevent water and pest intrusion and mold growth and stabilize the air temperatures, thereby improving the service and learning environment for students and lowering utility costs for LSSC.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services provided to students and visitors include instruction, academic advising, testing and tutoring, library services and community enrichment speakers, events and performances.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

High school students- 3,000 Community Citizens, including the elderly- 5,000 College students-10,000

-Student retention and completion rates.- Baseline data is available for comparison to post-improvement data.

-Energy efficiency- Utility savings can be measured as a result of the facility improvements.
