b. Describe the source of funding that can be used in lieu of state funding.



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The State funding is an eminent part of this programs, especially after Covid-19, when local funding, and corporate donations are more difficult to attain. Also, our consumers cannot self-afford the cost from a private academy. Approximately 95% of the consumers we serve come from Low Income households. The pandemic has affected our consumers much harder than the general citizen, being they have many challenges, physically and health related. We urge the Senate to grant us this appropriation

### If yes, indicate the amount of funds received and what the funds were used for.

ADE received \$311,000 PPP. Funds were spent to maintain ADE's employees and subsidize programming costs during the pandemic. Our agency offers ADT, Supported Employment, and Transportation. We DO NOT offer residential services. Agency for Persons with Disabilities is only reimbursing for physical or virtual services. Parents are afraid of sending consumers back physically, and only 35% of our MW consumers are able to perform the virtual learning. Our losses has exhausted our PPP.

### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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ADE's acclaimed Culinary Training Program has been operational since 2012. This exemplary program provides Culinary-Baking-Restaurant Maintenance Skills, and Employment Training to Adults with Developmental Disabilities. We have been operating this program through the support and funding from the Agency for Persons with Disabilities. The special appropriation has been granted for this project since 2013. We have a 100% competency score from APD, Parents and consumers are urging that The Florida Senate coninue funding this much needed model program. This budget request will also fund ADE's Silver Program, providing Geriatric Services to the DD population 55+ yrs. The program includes stimuli training in a tranquil environment with a Geriatric specialist and a licensed physical trainer. This program started in 2016, through a special approp from APD.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our Total Appropriation request is \$300,000 for the 2022 budget year.

- 1) \$200,000 will afford the ADE's Culinary Academy, which teaches our special population multiple areas within the culinary field. This will create a path towards economic self-sufficiency for our consumers of unique abilities.
- 2) \$100,000 of the funding request will be used to provide Geriatric Services to aging Seniors with Developmental Disabilities, no longer have the ability to join the workforce, but still need a meaningful and stimulating day activity. ADE will be monitoring the progress via Assessment, Progress Data taken 3 times a week, and a Monthly/Yearly Summary Report, as well as developing the goals yearly in the Individual Program Plan.
- 3) Other General Services: Educational Coordination, Case Management, Crisis Management, Counseling, Behavior programming, Employability Guidance-training, and Transportation will also be offered through this appropriation.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

- 1)The Culinary will include Recruitment and Skills Assessment, and Trainings, such as: Measurements, Food Groups, Kitchen Equipment and Tools, Healthy Eating Principles, Cooking on a Budget, Grocery Shopping in Bulk, Food Storage Methods, Kitchen Safety and Cleanliness, Refrigerate and Freeze Food Rules, and multiple other related skills. Chef Instructors, will guide our students in preparation of dishes that are integrated into our curriculum by Themes, such as: Foods of the World, Food prepared for Special Occasions, Savory vs. Sweet, the South Florida melting pot dishes, Quick 15/30 minute meals, Sandwich and Salad Prep, Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner Favorites, etc. Employability Skills are incorporated in the curriculum.
- 2) Silver Program will include geriatric services/physical training. It provides a stimulating program with recreational skills to enhance quality of life for seniors with Developmental Disabilities. Includes, Educational/Case Management Services and transportation.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Culinary Arts Program will serve 24 to 30 adults with developmental disabilities, and with the necessary abilities and behavior to be able to mange a high risk kitchen environment.

Silver program will serve a maximum of 6 adults with developmental disabilities 55 or older.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- 1) The Culinary Program trains our special population in multiple areas within the culinary field. Covering sophisticated to a more remedial curriculum, so all individual levels of consumers may benefit from these courses. This will create a path towards economic self-sufficiency in the field of Culinary Services to all consumers, comprising from chef assistant to restaurant maintenance.
- 2) The Silver Program provides Geriatric Services to aging Seniors with Developmental Disabilities who no longer have the ability or desire to join the workforce, but still need a meaningful and stimulating day activity.
- 3) ADE will be monitoring the progress via assessment data taken 3 times a week, and a Monthly Summary, as well as developing the goals yearly in the Individual Program Plan for both Culinary and Silver Program. Monitored by The Agency for Persons with Disabilities. Other General Services: Educational Coordination, Case Management, Crisis Management, and Transportation.
