Reduction of physical increase of run-off during storm related incidents, i.e hurricanes, tropical storms, or natural rain storms in rainy seasons. Review of reliable Transportation passage and Pedestrian Access to residential areas, and businesses. Observation of reduction of storm water pooling in low lying areas of street corridors and sidewalks where potential health hazards would normally occur.
