### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of this project is to provide technology and virtual reality simulations to CTE programs in Okaloosa County Schools. The technology will come in the form of seat management for computers in programs that currently do not have access to computers. The virtual reality simulations will support the Building Trades programs in five secondary schools.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

CTE courses educate students in skills that are currently needed in today's workforce. Throughout their coursework, teachers provide differentiated instruction in the form of hands-on, computer-based, virtual reality and simulations to provide students with the experience needed to be successful in that specific career. This request would help the teachers to fully do this.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will be able to use computers to learn and prepare for the future workforce. It will also help students prepare for their industry certifications on computers. The technology will come in the form of seat management for computers in programs that currently do not have access to computers. In addition to this, the students will be able to experience virtual simulations to better prepare them for the Building Trades career. The virtual reality simulations will support the Building Trades programs in five secondary schools. These systems will allow students to practice real-world skills while also lowering the consumable costs for the programs.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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At-Risk Youth
High School Students

This funding will support majority of the secondary students in Okaloosa County. This outreach number is greater than 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The overall outcome will be to improve the quality of education.

- -50% of students will show an increase in CTE grades from the first nine weeks to the third nine weeks in their specific CTE class after the integration of technology.
- -Secondary CTE programs will show a 10% increase in industry certifications earned as a result of this funding's support.
- The CTE program will evaluate changes in grades of students in the specific program areas receiving support.
   CTE will also document and record all industry certifications earned as a result of using the computers and virtual reality simulations.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the district is unable to meet these deliverables, the program will be deemed unsuccessful and as a result, this program will no longer be offered in Okaloosa County Schools.
