A consultant will be hired to oversee the renovation of the building (\$40,000).	310,000

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Gainesville Woman's Club is working to achieve a three-fold goal for these funds.

- 1. Retain the clubhouse for use as a community center, social services meeting and event space, and programming space for club volunteer and fundraising activities.
- 2. Repair the historic clubhouse to ensure safe, usable space for the community and social service events that are its primary function.
- 3. Support the arts, culture, civic engagement, education and libraries, and the health of the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

GWC supports community programs who use the clubhouse; including Alachua County Public Schools, Altrusa House Adult Daycare, Arbor Day Foundation, Boys Scouts of America local troops, Veteran's services, Girls Place of Alachua County, Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs, League of Women Voters, Peaceful Paths Domestic Abuse Network, United Nations Day, and the Malcolm Randall Veterans Hospital.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The GWC Clubhouse will provide a meeting space for community groups; a rental venue for community celebrations; and an art, educational, health, and wellness center for club members. Club members will engage in fundraising and volunteer services in the clubhouse. Fundraising will provide support to: Catholic Charities, UN Day, Trading Closets for Altrusa, and Peaceful Paths Domestic Abuse Program.



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d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population will include school-age children, adults, and senior citizens. The GWC clubhouse provides educational activities for children, meeting space for community members, and volunteer opportunities for senior citizens. During non-COVID times, over 10,000 community members utilize the clubhouse on yearly basis.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- Cultural experiences will be enriched by the restoration of this historic building and will result in its preservation as a historic landmark in the community. Records will be maintained for all venue use and estimates of building visitation.
 Quality of education in the community will be improved by allowing the building to serve as a location for educational gatherings. The Gainesville Woman's Club will maintain records of all educational gatherings.
 Tourism will be enhanced with the building's restoration to allow out-of-town groups to utilize space in the historic
