1. Project Title

Miami Lakes NW 162nd Street and NW 79th Avenue Drainage Improvements Project

4. Project/Program Description

The estimated cost of the Miami Lakes NW 162nd Street and NW 79th Avenue Drainage Improvements Project is \$1,082,225. The Town is requesting legislative appropriation of \$726,000, reflecting a Town local share/match contribution of \$356,225 to fund this Project. The Project consists of the construction of a new drainage system with exfiltration trenches, catch basins and manholes, road milling and resurfacing, pavement markings, and restoration in the following areas:

- 1) NW 162nd Street from NW 82nd Avenue to NW 79th Avenue.
- 2) NW 79th Avenue from NW 160th Terrace to NW 155th Street.

This Project is adjacent to the NW 159th Terrace Drainage Improvements Project, which the Town is funding as a targeted area for flood mitigation. In addition, this Project is in the vicinity of the Bob Graham Educational Center and will impact and benefit the Town's current Safe Routes to School Project along 79th Avenue. This Project continues the flood mitigation activities in the Royal Oaks community.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific goal is to construct the Miami Lakes NW 162nd Street and NW 79th Avenue Drainage Improvements Project. The purpose that will be achieved by the funds being requested are increased drainage capacity, reduced localized flooding, reduced standing rainwater, and protection of private property and life in residential neighborhoods.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities and services consist of the construction of a new drainage system with exfiltration trenches, catch basins and manholes, road milling and resurfacing, pavement markings, and restoration on NW 162nd Street from NW 82nd Avenue to NW 79th Avenue and on NW 79th Avenue from NW 160th Terrace to NW 155th Street.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services are flood mitigation activities to further reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage in the Royal Oaks community, as well as, the protection of residential property and life.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Target population served by this project is the Royal Oaks residential community in Miami Lakes. The project will directly impact approximately 120 homes.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is to complete the construction of the Miami Lakes NW 162nd Street and NW 79th Avenue Drainage Improvements Project. Expected benefits include improved drainage, reduced localized flooding, increased drainage capacity, improved stormwater management, eliminated standing rainwater, reduced probability of mosquito-transmitted diseases to the public, and reduced impact to property and life, enhanced environmental protection to the general public, improved transportation conditions, and improved groundwater and surface water quality. Outcome will be measured by field inspection and documentation of rainfall events.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
