12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Sandy Lane is a north/south, heavily traveled road connecting two major village roadways. Currently, the two-lane road does not have a bike path/pedestrian walkway. The completed project will provide these safety amenities to the underserved residents along Sandy Lane.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project will include constructing a multi-use pathway along Sandy Lane from Corkscrew Road to Broadway Avenue. The project will also include a pedestrian bridge crossing of the Estero River.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Service will not be provided to citizens. However, the project will provide citizens access to safe bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. This will allow residents to exercise and access nearby services, including public transportation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is citizens located along Sandy Lane. As the village's bicycle and pedestrian master plan continues to be implemented, the proposed improvements will eventually service a much larger population as it will become part of a regional bike/pedestrian system serving Estero and Lee County residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The expected benefit is increased access to safe bicycle and pedestrian facilities for the nearby residents. The success of the project is able to be measured by the number of citizens that will use the facilities after construction.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The Village of Estero proposes to include liquidated damages in the project's construction contract. Standard contract penalties for the contract with the state will be sufficient.
