#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This capital project will focus on programs and opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities to prepare for community employment. PARC's dedicated services include training, pre-employment, job search and work development opportunities. Trained staff and Community Coaches support the advancement of training and employment with community business partners and employers.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This capital project will focus on services for individuals with developmental disabilities. PARC has capacity for 250 to 400 participants to experience opportunities for employment training and increase access in the community. Services are delivered in a true work environment accepted by industry standards. PARC aligns with partners to offer customized employment and other life skills supports.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

PARC offers a large array of individualized opportunities designed to prepare individuals for community employment and inclusive experiences. PARC's dedicated services include training, pre-employment, vocational exploration, and work development opportunities. Trained staff and Community Coaches support the advancement of training and employment with community business partners and employers. Other services and programs include Financial Literacy, PARC in Bloom Horticulture, PARC Center Industries production, Food Safety, Healthy Living and Communication and Social competencies...

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



Individuals with disabilities and intellectual and developmental disabilities are served. The capacity is 250 to 400 adults on-site with additional persons served in supported employment. With completion of this project, those currently on wait lists or seeking PARC's services will be able to be served.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

### be measured?

Increased opportunity and additional participant enrollment for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities for easier access to training and supports. PARC promotes meaningful inclusion of all individuals with disabilities. To increase the experiences for individuals underserved and advocate for all to reach their fullest potential. PARC will work together to prepare potential employees to fulfill the needs of employers. Data to include community and business collaborations and employment outcomes. To enhance specific individual's economic self -sufficiency: Increased opportunity for training and inclusion is associated with improved quality of life, health, and social success. PARC will track data on participant enrollment, participation, referral source (Agency for Persons with Disabilities, Department of Education Division of Vocational Rehabilitation).
