4. Project/Program Description

The Brevard Reentry Portal is a collaboration of My Community Cares (MCC), the Brevard Reentry Task Force, the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC), the UCF Florida Prison Education Project (FPEP), and the Brevard Homeless Coalition (BHC) to facilitate the successful reintegration of ex-offenders returning to Brevard County based on evidenced-based practices. By replicating the models from the Jacksonville Reentry Center (JREC) and the Palm Beach County RESTORE Reentry Program, the Brevard County Reentry Portal will provide State inmates with pre- and post release services to assist in their transition back into the community in order to reduce recidivism and improve public safety. We also have a strong partnership with the Brevard Clerk of Court and have a one-of-a-kind collaboration that allows the ex-offenders to set-up realistic payment plans with the Clerk so they can secure a valid driver's license once they are in our program.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Brevard Reentry Portal in collaboration with the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC) seeks to provide releasing inmates with tools to become contributing members of the community. The purpose of the funds is to provide assistance to the FDC population returning to Brevard County in need of reintegration services that include employment and housing assistance, substance abuse treatment and mental health referrals. By funding this evidence-based reentry program, we will be able to assist releasing inmates who are integrating back into the community as we help them live successful, crime-free lives. By keeping our re-arrest rate significantly below the state average, we strive for increased public safety.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Clients served by these funds will receive risk needs assessment and case planning based on those needs. Activities and services include career development skills, education assistance, assistance in obtaining records, employment assistance, housing, emergency food, clothing, transportation, mental health, substance abuse services, SSI/SSDI application assistance, family reunification services, and assistance with obtaining a valid driver's license. Case managers also provide clients in need of a cognitive behavioral intervention with the University of Cincinnati's CBI program as we address their criminogenic needs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



Direct services include wraparound case management, career development skills, education assistance, assistance in obtaining records, employment assistance, housing, emergency food, clothing, transportation, mental health, substance abuse services, SSI/SSDI application assistance, family reunification services, and assistance with obtaining a valid driver's license. Case managers also provide clients in need of a cognitive behavioral intervention with the University of Cincinnati's CBI program, 24/7 Dad Program, and MRT-DWLS/R Program as we address their criminogenic needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

State inmates returning to Brevard County upon release that FDC identifies as moderate to high-risk to reoffend. Individuals to be served will be 201 to 400 per year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduced recidivism costs to the State of Florida taxpayers. Rearrest rates and Return to FDC rates. We expect a substantial return on investment monetarily and when measuring the potential of human capital. An independent evaluator has already agreed to donate his time to complete an evaluation of our program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

FDC will impose financial consequences of one percent of the total allocation if 100% of required reports are not timely filed.
