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4. Project/Program Description

The Training and Research Facility will be a state of the art training and research space, including an engineering lab to make apps/sensors/wearable devices. The facility will train a health care workforce for the region and advance FAU's research and community engagement mission by providing healthcare support. The facility will be used for patient-based interactions, research, education, community service, and for individuals to learn about advanced patient care options. It will also feature experiential learning opportunities involving faculty and students interacting with patients, and with patient actors who can present with maladies that students have to diagnose. Clinical care will be provided by licensed faculty and student trainees. Patient research also will be conducted by students and licensed professionals in the areas of clinical trials, physiology studies, medical devices, and wearable sensor technology.

To build a Health Sciences Training and Research Facility to train a health care workforce for the region and advance FAU's research and community engagement mission by providing healthcare support.

The Health Sciences Facility will have state of the art training and research space including an engineering lab to make apps/sensors/wearable devices; a gait analysis lab and exercise physiology studies; and a wet lab for analysis of patient samples and cellular/molecular research labs dedicated to Health Sciences. It will also feature experiential learning opportunities involving faculty and students interacting with patients, and with patient actors who can present with maladies that students have to diagnose.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Health Sciences Facility will be used for patient based interactions, research, education, and community service and for individuals to learn about advanced patient care options. Clinical care will be provided by licensed faculty and student trainees. Patient research also will be conducted by students and licensed professionals in the areas of clinical trials, physiology studies, medical devices, and wearable sensor technology.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



Residents in the community seeking clinical care and students being trained to fill critical healthcare jobs. The facility will be used for patient-based interactions, research, education, community service, and for individuals to learn about advanced patient care options. It will also feature experiential learning opportunities involving faculty and students interacting with patients. Hundreds of patients and students annually will benefit from the training, research, programs, and clinical care offered at the facility.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The facility will be used for patient based interactions, research, education, and community service and for individuals to learn about advanced patient care options. Students from Colleges of Nursing, Engineering and Computer Science, Medicine, and Social Work will work together in collaborative settings geared towards training them for a real world workforce. The facility will increase student cohorts in critical healthcare professions. Students will learn in state of the art education space with a simulation center, conference rooms, classrooms. FAU colleges and distinct programs follow stringent requirements to maintain accreditation by discipline specific organizations. Annually, a report of our accredited programs is submitted to the BOG.
