### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Participants will receive training and certification test prep in automotive repair, commercial drone operation, and computer aided drafting, as well as educational and skills training in 3D printing, computer programming, mechanical engineering, and shop skills with the aim of capacity building workforce skills enhancement and improved employability.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Aeronautics, computer aided drafting, 3D printing, computer programming, mechanical engineering, and shop skills. Certification test prep courses currently include ASE automotive tech through fleet management and Part 107 drone pilot certifications.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Skills training and certification test prep for all of the above.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged individuals, at-risk youth, high school students, and college students. 25-50 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Benefits/outcomes expected include:

Self-efficacy resulting from skills attainment and economic independence, improved skills development leading to improved quality of education, improved economic activity as a result of certifications attained and jobs through certifications, and immediate job opportunities through the development of enhanced economic self-sufficiency through improved skills and understanding of new workforce opportunities.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Balance of expended funds would be returned to the state if deliverables or performance measures are not met. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
