a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Extend the hours of the Southcentral/Southeast Focal Point (SCSEFP) that serves low-income, frail elders 60 years of age and older. Programs administered are targeted activities and services designed to provide opportunities for seniors to age-in-place with dignity and support services and to prevent and/or delay nursing home placement. Transportation to access health care, health and wellness activities, individual and group counseling, nutrition, recreation, and socialization.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Transportation services will provide access to nutritious breakfast and afternoon snack, transportation to and from medical appointments (including dialysis appointments), prescription drug pickup/delivery.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Afternoon activities to be made available to seniors during extended hours will include individual and group counseling, evidence-based exercise programs, recreational activities, life-learning classes and socialization.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Senior citizens. 900 senior citizens annually are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Blood pressure readings recorded and tracked on an individual basis to document improvement and/or outcomes. Prescreening, assessment and tracking.

Increase in number of participants gaining access to nutritious meals.
