Palm Beach County is the recipient of CARES Act U.S. Treasury funds in the amount of \$261 million. Funding was spent for emergency assistance, mortgage assistance, business grants, COVID 19 sheltering, testing, and isolation and emergency personnel. Palm Beach will receive \$290,730,026 in American Rescue Plan funding which will be used on pandemic-related services and infrastructure projects.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

A key initiative of the Board of County Commmissioners' 10-Year-Plan to End Homelessness, adopted in 2008, was to establish resource centers in the County to provide temporary shelter and wrap-around case management services to assist individuals in addressing their homelessness. Palm Beach County's first homeless resources center opened in 2012 in West Palm Beach with 20 beds for women, 40 for men, and 6 beds reserved for emergency drop off clients by law enforcement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Through the homeless resource center, residents will be provided wrap-around case management to assist individuals in addressing their homelessness and educate on opportunities for economic self-sufficiency.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Individuals utilizing the center will be provided bedding and shelter in addition to other services to address personal struggles and overcome homelessness.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project are homeless residents of Palm Beach County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Through construction of this project Palm Beach County hopes to see a reduction in its homeless population and increase the economic mobility of residents. Palm Beach County's Department of Social Services will monitor homeless population data and trends in social services to measure outcomes of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet performance measures may lead to corrective action, contract termination, and/or return of funds.
