#### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Promise Inc. which provides affordable housing for 125 individuals with special needs, operates a thrift shoppe for purposes of providing employment opportunity for its special needs community. The current retail space is rented at a cost of \$70,000/year, and the landlord has signalled significant rent increases. Funds will be used to begin the process of planning, design and engineering of a new home for the thrift shoppe.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to provide a replacement location for existing rented space which employs individuals with special needs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Special needs community would receive training and employment opportunity, allowing them to earn an income. In addition, Treasures Thrift Shoppe provides the community with a source for affordable clothing, furniture and other merchandise.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Individuals with Special Needs. Promise Inc. provides services for 125 individuals with special needs who call the Promise affordable housing community home.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Providing employment and volunteer opportunities for individuals with special needs. Monthly reports will be provided to the Promise Board of Directors on special needs individuals served.



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f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

No payments until agreed upon milestones met.
