The UF Forensic Interview Center will be the center for forensic interviewing education in Florida. It will work with the Department of Health (DOH), to train CPT forensic interviewers, to develop and help administer a credentialing test, to train on forensic interviewing and to have periodic quality assurance review. The Center also will work with FDLE, law enforcement agencies, and Child Advocacy Centers. The goal is to have a center of excellence that assures the most advanced techniques.

Training of CPT forensic interviewers

Training of other forensic interviewers (CACs, FDLE, and law enforcement)

Helping to develop a certification test for forensic interviewers

Research about the most advanced interviewing techniques and state of the art processes
