12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

1. The completion of the building will allow the center to expand the numbers from 70 to over 200 at-risk youth. 2. Having a larger space will allow the center to further and better collaborate with the school district of Indian River County and the Learning Alliance. 3. Consolidate Crossover Mission operations to be in one space. The athletic department, academic department, and administration will all now operate in the same building.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

1. Renovations of the building, 2. Construction and outfitting of the building by Proctor Construction, 3. Oversight by Board of Directors, Crossover Mission management team, and Bob Parsons as Crossover Mission's manager of the building project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

- 1. Crossover Mission will serve under-resourced and at-risk youth from ages 8-25.
- 2. Crossover Mission will provide athletic training and academic support which includes but is not limited to a men's basketball league, providing a safe space for students, advocacy for the students, college and career planning for more than 200 youth, and support to all of the families in the program as well.
- 3. Crossover Mission will directly work with the school district of Indian River County to coordinate summer programs, work with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to put together seminars for the students to interact with law enforcement and ease the tensions, and partner with mental health services in Indian River County to provide therapy to the students and their families.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The target population is the under resourced youth of Indian River County ages 8-25. The center expects to start being able to serve over 200 students and their families but the goal is to be able to provide services to over 500 at-risk youth. 6% of Indian River County's youth, aged 16-19, are neither working nor in school. The average annual income of black families is \$27,000 less than that of white families. School absenteeism is an issue for children in Indian River County, with 17.2% of students being absent more than 21 days as compared to 11.3% in the rest of the state. This is the target demographic that the center will be working with and a larger space will allow the center to offer services to families in need.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is to be able to complete the renovations and have a fully-functional facility to run the athletic training and student academic mentoring/support. This project will be measured by financial reporting, tracking program attendance of student participation, monitoring student grades and behavior reports, measuring student athletic success both in school and beyond, and avoiding escalation of any of these at-risk youth in the Department of Juvenile Justice. The center will also track high school graduation rates, enrollment in college, and enrollment in further vocational training.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The penalty would be to return the money. Furthermore, the money would not be awarded or it will be refunded if the contractual agreement is not met (i.e. building progress halted and/or Crossover Mission program halted).
