We received \$12,712,034 in total HEERF funding. 50% (\$6,356,017) is allocated for distribution directly to students as emergency financial aid grants - \$2,708,794 has been distributed to students. Remaining 50% for institutional use. \$1,354,397 for refunds to students for room & board fees in 2020. \$1,354,397 to cover COVID related operating expenses & operational losses due to COVID19. Remaining \$3,647,223 will be used for COVID19 related expenses and building a more resilient campus.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Through the Institute for Classical Education at Flagler College, we will develop a model to be shared with other schools for focusing on first-year students, through the Classical, Liberal Arts Education lens, as a way to increase retention, and promote a balanced world-view in the higher education arena. Once established on campus, the Institute will plan and host research workshops and conferences to allow, students, scholars, and guests to participate in classical model programming.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Strategic hiring of key faculty trained in the classical model of education to work directly with our Freshmen students in their first-year seminar courses. These faculty will be trained in how to teach classical texts to first-year students, will promote free inquiry in the classroom, and instill in our students the skills needed to think critically.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Full-time faculty teaching First Year Seminar course students. The development of a retention model based on the classical model of education. Eventually the Institute will plan and host workshops, conferences, and guest scholars. Additionally the Institute will provide academic fellowship & mentoring opportunities to students engaged in scholarly studies and provide training to K-12 teachers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

College Students and Faculty... Greater than 800 in year one.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Enrich Cultural Experience - Through the FYS course, students learn about the value and responsibilities of citizenship in a diverse democracy. Consistent with the classical model of education, students will read about political philosophy and the history of science, or explore the cultural meanings of business and entertainment. Flagler students are living in the Oldest City in the United States. - Measurement - Course evaluations will help us evaluate the impact on our students' cultural experience. Additionally, we will evaluate the level of our student's community engagement. Improve Quality of Education - First year students will benefit from having Full-time faculty trained in the Classical model of education teaching their first year seminar courses. Measurement - Evaluating Flagler College Retention rates. Improve Economic Activity - We will hiring additional faculty, thus creating jobs. We will also be producing additional graduates with the critical thinking skills.
