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4. Project/Program Description

Fatherhood PRIDE (Parental Responsibility Inspiring Dads Everywhere) provides education and support for fathers and father figures through case management, group education and one-on-one support. The program addresses the comprehensive needs of fathers and improves their relationships with their children by increasing financial self-efficacy, fatherhood responsibility, job-driven workforce development and reducing domestic violence and recidivism rates.

Research shows father involvement has a direct correlation to the health and well-being of pregnant women and children, while helping to create the framework for a successful childhood. Adults and children in single-parent households are at higher risk of developing adverse health effects, such as depression and substance abuse. Fatherhood programs work to change the dynamic by introducing positive, goal-orientated behaviors that strengthen the family structure.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of the funding is to bring the Fatherhood PRIDE program in Duval County to full scale as in the past. The purpose is to enable fathers to play a critical role in the health and well-being of their children by providing them with education on financial training and parenting skills through the Fatherhood PRIDE. Children suffer due to lack of father involvement both financially and emotionally. The goal of the program is to address the comprehensive needs of fathers and improve their relationship with their children by increasing financial self-efficacy, fatherhood responsibility, job-driven workforce development, and reducing domestic violence and recidivism rates. Fathers will participate in a tailored approach, in addition to accessing case management and wraparound services to ensure a holistic approach to meet their needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Fatherhood PRIDE will provide case management, group education utilizing evidence- and research-based curricula and one-on-one support. Enrolled participants will receive comprehensive case management services and referrals to needed resources such as food, housing, transportation, education, employment services, health insurance needs, child care and child support navigation up to one year after their enrollment date. Case managers will be trained to utilize seven specific approaches to case management in Fathers will also have the opportunity to participate in additional services as needed: one-on-one support and referrals for job-driven employment services such as resume writing, interview skills, one-on-one employment counseling, job training, job search and post-employment supports; domestic violence/intimate partner violence/dating violence (DV/IPV) screening, training, and referral; and Understanding Dads/Mom as Gateway training for mothers to improve co-parenting relationships.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Fatherhood PRIDE will use several curricula to address responsible fatherhood and financial literacy (Boot Camp for New Dads, 24/7 Dad, FDIC Money Smart). Enrolled participants will receive comprehensive case management services and referrals to needed resources such as food, housing, transportation, education, employment services, health insurance needs and child care referrals.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Fathers. Will serve approximately 100-200 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Enroll at least 100 fathers annually in the project. 90 percent of community fathers enrolled in case management is engaged with their child.

75% of fathers enrolled in case management will demonstrate knowledge gain in responsible parenting and increased self-efficacy for improving parenting and co-parenting skills.

75% of fathers enrolled in case management will demonstrate knowledge gain in financial literacy and increased selfefficacy for increased financial responsibility.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Meet at least 85% of the project outcome/deliverables. If 85% of the outcomes/deliverables are not meet annually there will be a 10% reduction in funding the next year.
