4. Project/Program Description

\$250,000 request to continue non-recurring funding to expand the Special Olympics Florida Unified Champion Schools Program to a total of 318 K-12 schools and 17 colleges throughout the State of Florida. The program brings young people with and without disabilities together to compete in athletic competitions, to engage in youth leadership and advocacy activities, to promote whole school engagement through activities that further the acceptance and inclusion of youth with disabilities, and to promote sports/play programs and opportunities for younger children with disabilities to improve physical, cognitive and social skills through the Young Athletes Program. There is both anecdotal and quantitative evidence that supports the effectiveness of the program in promoting inclusion of young people with disabilities in school activities and a reduction in harmful behavior such as bullying which result from a lack of understanding and acceptance of individuals with disabilities.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The program furthers the State's goal to increase inclusion of students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) in schools; instill lifetime understanding in future generations of value of inclusion; reduce behaviors such as bullying; increase general physical fitness levels of children with I/DD; improve self-confidence and social skills of children with I/DD; provide opportunities for children with I/DD to participate in school leadership activities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Athletic competitions (some formally sanctioned by the FHSAA) that allow children and youth with & without disabilities to compete together; Leadership development activities that bring children & youth with & without disabilities together to plan & execute public service projects; whole school engagement activities promoting school inclusion of children with I/DD.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services as described in b. above are provided to students, faculty, support personnel, and family members.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

K-12 and college students with and without disabilities. 600 students impacted in Special Olympics College programs and 218,897 students impacted via the Unified Champion Schools and Young Athletes Program and service projects throughout Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



be measured?

Increase understanding and acceptance of young people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in the school community. Improve self-confidence, social and motor skills, and improve physical fitness levels of young people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Data is managed based upon participation rates along with periodic surveys of young people, parents, and school system personnel to measure attitudes and outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Reduced payment with contract termination for persistent failure to maintain acceptable performance
